EUDR

On 4 December 2025, the Council of the EU and the European Parliament reached a provisional political agreement to delay the application of the EU Deforestation Regulation (EUDR). The agreement postpones the compliance date for all operators until 30 December 2026, with an additional six months (until June 2027) for micro and small operators. Learn more here.

Training events for quality managers of certified companies in 2026 will take place in USA, Croatia, Poland, France and Belgium. More information will be published in the following months here. The second editions of the EN*plus*[®] ST 1001 and EN*plus*[®] 1003 standards were published on 1st October 2025. Companies have to adapt to the minor changes introduced with the new versions by the end of 2025. Check out the documents here.

Market Surveillance Project

The Market Surveillance Project is an initiative aiming at analysing EN*plus*[®] certified bags of pellets randomly taken from the market in order to assure compliance with the scheme's standards. The project is part of EN*plus*[®] procedures for constant quality control and is open to anyone who wants to submit a sample of certified pellets for analysis.
